RECOVERY ACT AWARD SUMMARY Awards to Entities in Florida February 17, 2009 through June 30, 2012 Preliminary

This report summarizes Recovery Act funds awarded to entities in Florida through June 30, 2012. Funding information is cumulative from February 17, 2009 through June 30, 2012 while information on jobs is for the April through June 2012 quarter only. This report is based on preliminary data submitted by recipients of Recovery Act funds as of July 30, 2012. These reports are subject to correction through September 19, 2012 at which time final reports for the quarter will be published.

Recovery Act funds include two broad categories. The first category includes reports required to be reported through the federal reporting system. These include grants, contracts and loans to or through state agencies, counties, cities or other entities. The other major category includes mandatory benefits made directly to people based on their eligibility. These funds are not reported through the federal reporting system. Information about these funds has been gathered from state and federal agency reports.

Key observations for the quarter:

- For the prime awards that are reported through the federal reporting system, over 80% of funds have been spent.
- The number of direct jobs reported for the quarter has declined significantly since last fall as many Recovery Act awards are reaching their end.
- In the last quarter the majority of the expenditures were in mandatory programs with the largest expenditures on extended unemployment benefits and supplemental nutrition (SNAP or food stamps).



Report	Description of Information

Mandatory Funds Summary	This table recaps the mandatory benefits to people in Florida. These funds are not reported through the federal reporting system but have been compiled based on state and federal agency reports.
Direct Jobs	This table summarizes the direct jobs that are reported through the federal reporting system. These are only for the reporting quarter and only for full-time equivalents (FTEs) funded directly with Recovery Act funds.
Jobs History	This table shows the quarterly jobs reports over the history of the Recovery Act. Broader reports of employment impact based on summaries from the Council of Economic Advisors are shown as reported, however these reports have not been published since in recent months.



The Council of Economic Advisors (CEA) Estimates for the April through June 2011 quarter were published in the 8th Quarterly Report dated December 9, 2011. Like the Quarter 1, 2011 report, CEA did not publish an appendix showing state-level estimates. The state estimate was made based on the proportion of Florida jobs to US jobs in the most recent CEA report that included state-level estimates (Quarter 4, 2010). The range of CEA employment impact estimates is from 2,159,000 to 4,187,000. The mid-point of these estimates is 3,173,000. Estimates for prior quarters have been substantially revised. In comparsion to CEA, the range of estimates by the Congressional Budget Office for the same period is from 500,000 to 2,900,000. The Council of Economic Advisors has not published the statutorily required quarterly report since December 9, 2011.
