






## Caseload Trends

April 2007 = 100%

















#### Percentage Receiving Benefits in June 2011

Of Adults Receiving Cash in Sept. 1996




#### Number Ever Receiving Benefits

Of 155,071 Adults Receiving Cash in Sept. 1996




#### Aggregate Months of Cash Assistance

Sept. 1996 Adults in Subsequent 177 Months




## Adults with Earnings

QE 3/31/1996 through QE 12/31/2010




## Aggregate Earnings






## TANF Children in Sept. 1996 Who Are Now Adults








#### Children Receiving Cash Assistance in Sept. 1996 who were adults in June 2011



# **Some Conclusions**15 Years After Welfare Reform

- In Florida, "welfare as we knew it" has ended.
- For adult-headed families, TANF is short-term
  assistance, not an ongoing income support program.
- The predominant safety net program for low-income families in Florida is SNAP.
- Most long-staying adult recipients have been excepted from the work requirement due to a medically verified need to care for a disabled family member.
- Intergenerational dependence on cash welfare payments is a thing of the past.
